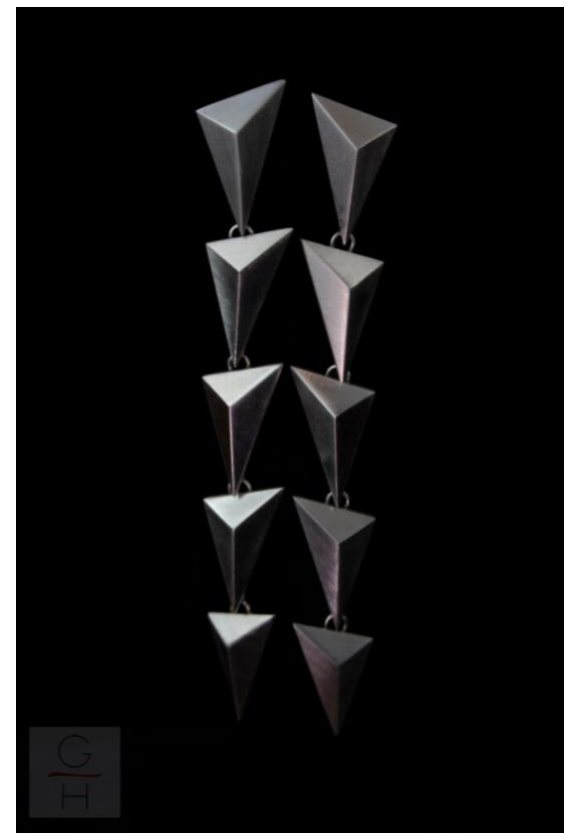
Maria Samora, jeweler
